FINAL 2023 ENTRY REQUIREMENTS FOR ALL HORSES ENTERING ARAPAHOE PARK RACETRACK (REVISED 5/10/23)

All horses stabled at Arapahoe Park must have a current negative Coggins test drawn within 12 months on file in the racing office, and with the commission veterinarian. If the Coggins test expires mid-meet it must be redone.

NO IN/OUT PRIVILEGES. (Emergency situations may qualify for an exception, reach out to the Head of Security)

For any horse leaving the grounds, please supply the following information to the racing office:

- (1) Horse Identification
- (2) Intended Destination
- (3) Reason for departure
- (4) Date of exit

FOR RE-ENTRY TO ARAPAHOE PARK GROUNDS:

A new Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) will be required as well as a negative Coggins test result within 30 (thirty) days for ALL horses and a negative piroplasmosis, T.equi specie, for racing Quarter horses (within 30 days).

If the required testing timeline has expired, new testing must be completed upon re-entry. Additionally, approval must be obtained from the General Manager and Director of Racing of Arapahoe Park before horses will be permitted re-entry onto the racetrack premises. Please note that this requirement is not specific to quarter horses; this requirement will be for all horses entering the grounds.

With guidance from the Department of Agriculture piroplasmosis tests will be required for only the *T.equi* species of the disease for all racing Quarter Horses within one year.

A Certificate of Veterinary Inspections (CVI) must be completed within 30 days of arrival for all horses (including stable ponies). At a minimum the following information must be included

Place of Origin: Contact name, location, phone, email

- **Destination Information:** Point of contact, location, phone, email
- Veterinarian Information: Name, Clinic, Accreditation Number, Address
- Horse's identifiable factors: Breed, sex, color, age, permanent identification (microchip, tattoo)
- Equine infectious anemia (EIA) test information: Test result, date of test, lab
 where testing occurred, lab ID number
- Vaccine information: Must include injection dates and type of vaccine
- Certificate of Veterinary Inspection information: Number, issue date
- Transport information: Date, purpose of movement

Please make sure that the necessary tests are performed prior to arriving at Arapahoe Park. No horses will enter the grounds without the above testing having been performed and without proper documentation. Should anyone bring horses to the racetrack without proper test results, that person and his/her horses would be turned away and not allowed to access the grounds.

The following vaccinations are required for **covered horses and Quarter horses**, including stable ponies; Eastern Equine Encephalomyelitis (EEE) and Western Equine Encephalomyelitis (WEE), West Nile Virus (WNV), rabies, tetanus, (within one year), influenza and rhinopneumonitis (within six months) (see rule below for additional **covered horse** requirements). Include the vaccination information on your CVI. (Please check with your veterinarian at time of vaccination to ensure the above information is still required by HISA). The Colorado Racing Commission is currently following HISA vaccination guidelines to protect all equine on the backside.

HISA Regulation 2143. Racehorse Monitoring

- a) All Horses, including stable ponies, entering the Racetrack grounds must have proof of health certificate and required vaccinations, which shall include:
- (1) Certificate of veterinary inspection within the prior 5 days or fewer days if high risk situations dictate;
- (2) Verification of EEE/WEE/WNV (encephalitides), rabies, and tetanus vaccinations within the prior 12 months;

- (3) Verification of Influenza and Rhinopneumonitis vaccinations within the prior 180 days or fewer days if high risk situations dictate; and
- (4) Verification of Negative Equine Infectious Anemia (Coggins) Test within the calendar year or in a shorter period of time if high risk situations dictate.
- (b) Each Racetrack shall submit the following information to the Authority with respect to each Horse on its grounds:
- (1) Horse identification;
- (2) Origin of Horse;
- (3) Date of entry;
- (4) Verification of certificate of veterinary inspection; and
- (5) Verification of vaccinations.
- (c) Each Racetrack shall submit the following information to the Authority with respect to each Horse leaving its grounds:
- (1) Horse identification;
- (2) Intended destination;
- (3) Reason for departure;
- (4) Date of exit;
- (5) Vehicle license plate; and
- (6) Transporter.
- (d) Horses moving interstate must meet the entry requirements of the destination State, the State Racing Commission in the destination State, and the individual Racetracks or Training Facilities to which the horse is being shipped in the destination State.
